Ritsumeikan University, Kinugasa campus(立命館大学、衣笠キャンパス)

For example, 100% tuition fee reduction, 50% tuition fee reduction, and monthly allowance of 80,000yen(around 27,000bath) for undergraduate students and 120,000yen(around41,000bath) for graduate students.
