

## Thammasat University Notification on Guidelines for Students from Countries with Ongoing Political Disputes

Thammasat University maintains a neutral stance in all political disputes. Our aim for international students is to provide academic support and knowledge in an environment that values equality, respect, and inclusion. In light of ongoing political disputes in various regions, Thammasat University has issued the following guidelines to support students affected by such situations and to promote a respectful, inclusive academic environment.

- 1. If you are facing emotional, academic, or other challenges due to the situation in your home country, please seek assistance from your Faculty's Student Affairs Department, the Office of International Affairs, your host program, or a health professional.
- 2. Engage in all discussions, particularly those involving political matters, with respect and consideration for differing viewpoints.
- 3. Be mindful and sensitive to how political events may affect both yourself and others. Avoid making assumptions based on nationality, ethnicity, or background.
- 4. Stay informed through credible news sources, but take care of your mental health by limiting exposure to distressing information when necessary.
- 5. Any personal concerns shared with university staff or support services will be handled with confidentiality and care.
- 6. For academic support or any issues related to your studies, please contact your faculty directly.
- 7. If you are currently in your home country and political conditions are preventing you from returning to continue your studies, please contact your faculty or the Office of International Affairs for guidance and assistance.
