



Announcement of Thammasat University

On

Exchange Programs with Partner Universities with Exchange Student Scholarships for Academic Year 2026

This announcement is made by the Office of International Affairs regarding the application and selection processes for both Bachelor and Master degree students to participate in exchange programs with partner universities for Academic Year 2026, starting from January 2027. Reaffirming Thammasat University's goal to promote our students to acquire international, life-long and academic experiences through exchange programs, selected students will be entitled to study in overseas courses at a partner university not exceeding ONE academic year as an exchange, non-degree seeking student. Under a university budget allocation for exchange programs, managed by the Office of International Affairs, selected students are eligible for scholarships to fund their exchange study abroad.

The conditions and eligibility criteria:

1. Number of participating universities: 92 Universities and 1 Program

2. Qualifications:

2.1 Full-time and currently enrolled Thammasat students:

- Bachelor Degree: Students must have completed at least one academic year or submit evidence showing that the applicant is awaiting academic results, either of which must be presented to the selection committee on the date of interview. Failure to do so will render the applicant as disqualified and will not be eligible for an interview.
- Master degree: Students must have studied for at least 1 semester with an academic result from at least 1 semester.

2.2 Students must meet GPA requirements as specified in the appendix.

2.3 Students must provide a language test score as required by the partner university or in accordance with particular conditions as specified in the appendix.

2.4 Students of a Bachelor and Master degree combined degree program must have accumulated credits not exceeding 90 credits.

2.5 Students must be physically and mentally healthy.

3. Application conditions

3.1 Have parents' consent and financial support throughout the entire exchange program and agree to abide by the regulations determined by the Office of International Affairs and Thammasat University.

3.2 Must have permission from an academic advisor and responsible faculties on a proposed study plan and credit transfer plan.

3.3 The applicants are not and will not be engaged in any other exchange programs managed by the Office of International Affairs or their faculties until this application is finalized.

3.4 Students who are selected, but later cancel without appropriate reasons will not be eligible to apply for other exchange programs.

3.5 Exchange students are required to perform a credit transfer process as required by the university and responsible faculties.

3.6 After returning to Thammasat University upon completion of a program, students are required to complete the credit transfer in accordance with the student's faculty regulations before their graduation. The Registrar's office will record "Leave" on the transcript of a returned exchange student who does not complete the credit transfer process.

3.7 The length of exchange study will not exceed two (2) academic terms. Accordingly, permission to enroll as an exchange student for one semester or one full academic year will also be subject to the approval of the host university.

3.8 Selected students must commence their exchange study as specified in the appendix.

3.9 Selected students are not permitted to extend their length of exchange study.

3.10 Health and accident insurances are required prior to students' travel and must cover the entire exchange period.

3.11 The Office of International Affairs has full authorization not to nominate selected students who do not comply with the conditions, regulations and procedures as specified above.

3.12 Application conditions are subject to change for purposes of suitable academic standards without prior notice.

3.13 Returned exchange students are required to submit their study reports through an acknowledgement of responsible faculties to the Office of International Affairs within 30 days upon on student's return.

4. Students' status

4.1 Selected students will be categorized as Thammasat exchange students and will pay the academic fees for overseas study at partner universities at the extra rates as stipulated in the announcement of Thammasat University regarding the rate of fees for exchange programs for Bachelor and Master degree students: Academic Year 2015.

4.2 Students will hold the status of an exchange, non-degree seeking student at a partner university.

5. Exchange program fees

5.1 Students selected for an exchange program will pay the fees as prescribed in item 4.1.

5.2 Other fees as indicated in the exchange agreement (if any).

5.3 Selected students must pay the exchange program fees at least 30 days prior to their international travel. A delay in making such a payment without appropriate reasons will lead to possible cancellation of participation in the program.

5.4 Thammasat international students who have received Thammasat scholarships are also required to pay the fees as prescribed in item 4.1 and other fees and expenses by themselves. Thammasat university will suspend the scholarship to these students during their exchange study periods.

Note: In case there is a change in the exchange program fees, the latest announcement of the fees shall be in effect with details provided as soon as possible.

6. Details and eligibility criteria for Exchange Scholarships

6.1 The selection decision and amount of scholarship made by the exchange selection committee is deemed to be final.

6.2 Scholarship recipients must comply with Thammasat University scholarship regulations and are required to participate in occasional events organized by the university and the Office of International Affairs.

6.3 Scholarship recipients who are unable to complete their exchange study or satisfy the academic requirements at their host university without appropriate reason shall return the scholarship monies received.

7. Selection criteria

7.1 The Thammasat exchange selection committee is authorized to consider and make a decision which will be deemed final.

7.2 The consideration process will be divided into two parts: (1) document submission and (2) interview result.

7.3 Criteria include:

- Academic performance
- Command of languages
- Capacity to represent Thammasat University and Thailand well
- Proposed study plan
- Good preparation for living on one's own

7.4 It is important to note that the Thammasat exchange selection committee will only make a selection decision of Thammasat applicants who meet the criteria for student exchange and deserve to be nominated, but the final decision to accept these nominated students rests with the partner university at their discretion and shall be deemed final.

7.5 Any scholarships and grants which may be provided to exchange students by partner universities will be subject to their discretion or by state agencies in those countries only.

8. Required documents

8.1 A Thammasat exchange application form with a proposed study plan.

8.2 An academic transcript not exceeding 30 days validity.

- Bachelor degree applicants must submit a transcript showing at least 1 academic year result.
- Master degree applicants must submit a transcript showing at least 1 semester result.

8.3 Language test scores as determined by a partner university or Thammasat University or any proof indicating that the applicants are awaiting test results. Applicants who are not able to submit the language test result on the interview date will be considered as unqualified and will not be eligible for an interview.

8.4 A supporting form from an academic advisor.

8.5 A parental consent and financial support form.

8.6 One 2X2 inch photos (not older than 6 months with a white or blue background, no hat or sunglasses) attached to the application.

8.7 A copy of the student's national ID card.

8.8 A copy of the student's household registration.

8.9 A copy of parents' ID card or household registration.

9. How to apply (Online Application form)

9.1 Students must carefully read the announcement and the qualifications and application conditions of "Exchange Programs with Partner Universities with Exchange Student Scholarships for Academic Year 2026".

9.2 Students click "Register" (Apply Online) at <https://oia.tu.ac.th/outgoing/> or <https://oia.tu.ac.th/program/register-new-user/>.

9.3 Students fill in the required information completely and correctly.

9.4 Students attach complete document files as specified.

9.5 If all the information on the application is complete and correct, the student clicks "Submit".

9.6 The student's faculty/college/institution reviews and confirms the information and clicks "Confirm" in the system to officially approve the student's nomination to participate in the student exchange program.

10. Application deadline and interview date

10.1 From now until 5 June 2026

10.2 The list of students eligible for an interview will be announced within the 3rd week of June 2026.

10.3 The interview date will be during June 2026.
