

Kanagawa University 2026/2027 Japanese Language and Culture Program

Kanagawa University offers a short-term intensive language program that is open to individuals from countries and regions around the world. Focusing on Japanese language study, the program's objective is to improve Japanese proficiency and deepen understanding of both traditional Japanese culture and various aspects of contemporary Japan by taking classes related to Japan, going on field trips and having the opportunity to directly experience the tea ceremony, calligraphy, and so forth. Opportunities to interact with Kanagawa University students have also been incorporated into the program.

<Eligibility>

- Applicants must be 18 years of age or older on the first day of the program.
- Those who can participate in the entire program schedule from start to finish.
- Those who are enrolled in an undergraduate course (equivalent to a Japanese university's 4-year degree course) or who have obtained a "Bachelor's degree". (Those who have only graduated high school are not eligible to apply)

Japanese proficiency at JLPT N3 level or below

* Applicants who have no knowledge of hiragana or katakana will be required to complete a designated assignment before the program begins.

- Those who can arrange their own visa, if necessary (we will send you an acceptance letter after you are accepted.)
- Those who have the English capability to follow a lecture in English (Hands-on Experience of Japanese Culture and Lectures About Japan are conducted in English)
- Applicants must obtain travel insurance valid in Japan in their home country before traveling to Japan. Kanagawa University does not arrange insurance for participants.

【NOTE】

- After the program has been confirmed to proceed after the deadline of the application period and the applicant's participation has been approved, the applicant is required to pay the application fee of JPY 12,000. The application fee is non-refundable, regardless of the reason for cancellation.

- All participants in the Kanagawa University Japanese Language and Culture Program are required to obtain travel insurance valid in Japan in their home country before traveling to Japan. The insurance must cover the period from the day before the program starts through the Sunday following the end of the program. Participants will be required to submit a copy of their insurance certificate or policy before departure. Kanagawa University does not arrange insurance for participants. - For the applicants from non-partner universities, please submit the application form with all the required documents by the application deadline. However, this program is intended primarily for students from Kanagawa University's partner universities. Applications from students at partner universities will generally be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications from students at non-partner universities will be considered after the application deadline only if places remain available. Applicants from non-partner universities will be contacted after the application period to be announced whether their application has approved or not.

◆ Japanese Language Classes

A) Aim: To improve oral communication skills through interviews with university staff and interaction with KU students, and to learn practical, authentic Japanese.

B) Target participants: Absolute beginners – pre-intermediate (N3/Level 3 or less in Japanese Language Proficiency Test.) Beginners are welcome, however those who have no knowledge of Japanese characters must learn hiragana and katakana before joining the program

- Class Hours: Mon - Fri, approx. 3 hours/day, 31 hrs. in total
- Class Size: Approx. 10 students/class
- Placement Test: This will be held on the first day of the program in order to ensure that each participant is able to study in a class of the appropriate level.
- Presentation: A final presentation in Japanese will be held on the last day of each term.
- All students receive a final grade report.

	*Content (Examples)
Lectures about Japan	Academics of Kanagawa University will give a lecture regarding topics such as Society, History, Economics etc.
Hands-on Experiences of Japanese Culture	Ikebana, Yukata experience, Traditional artwork, Visit to Japanese traditional architecture etc.
Student Exchange Meeting	Interaction with KU students (Interview, Presentations about Japanese cultures etc.)
Weekend Activity	Fieldtrip to Kamakura, Yokohama, Tokyo etc. This activity is a part of the program, so attendance is mandatory.

In the case that the number of applicants in a particular level either reaches capacity or does not reach the minimum number of participants required, there is a possibility for you to be asked to attend only a single term even though you had applied for both terms.
